Pelagio operates an electric chipping hammer to dislodge the plaster from the brick. To help loosen the bond between the plaster and brick, the plaster is hit with a blunt hammer before the chipping instrument is used. Mark Batchelor, sales manager/owner of the company, will fill the joist pockets, remove as much of the tar from the brick as possible and reset four to five courses of brick before winter sets in. In the spring, the company will remove isolated spots of plaster from the wall and then seal the brick with a color sealer. The Lowell company is a historical building preservation specialist. Batchelor said he would provide any business in the downtown area with a free estimate on restoration of their brick buildings.

# Hooves Down!

•••• Planning Commission recommends that the City not allow horse figure on roof of building.

Based on the fact that there is no regulation allowing for signs on the roof of a commercial building, the Lowell Planning Commission voted to deny a variance request from Turn West to keep its horse figure on the store's roof.

Turn West owner, William Bolt, made the request in an effort to achieve what he determined as a reasonable level of identification for his store.

"With the amount of setback, store identification is difficult." Bolt stated in a letter to the planning commission.

Other factors for the request were identified by John Wallace, a planner with the DPm Group. They included:

- · Difficulty being identified when situated among other stores.
- · Being screened from the west and south by other buildings (Lowell 5 Theatre and the old Hardee's restaurant).

"I don't think a horse on the roof makes it any easier to identify the store when driving past the shopping center." planning commissioner B.J. Thompson said. "I don't want to see the dollar store put up a dollar figure on its roof."

Thompson said she wasn't opposed to possibly having the horse placed elsewhere. Turn West has the opportunity to be included in the

common sign located closer to Fulton. "A lot of developers offer a common sign to multiple tenants to appease them," Wallace said. "In reality, it is usually

only the anchor stores which end up with the right size of sign for proper identification." He added that studies have shown with a limited time to observe a sign, most motorists are only capable of compre-

hending about five words on a sign.

"With a common sign having multiple tenants, this generally results in many of the smaller panel signs not being seen," Wallace said. Horse Figure, cont'd., pg. 8

# New welcome signs will greet visitors with more feeling

Gordie Barry remembers when first coming to Lowell, a sign upon entering Ionia County stated Lowell was the best kept secret.

"I guess you can say I don't want to keep the secret anymore," said Barry, who is the pastor at the First United Methodist Church and a Lowell planning commissioner.

So, Barry pushed forward an idea that has been batted around the city for about the past 10 to 15 years—installing decorative boundary signs on the north, south, east, and west entrances of the city.


"I have seen it in other areas and I know what it feels like to have a nice sign indicating the community," Barry said.

Currently, the only signage indicating the city limits and welcoming citizens and visitors are the regular square corporate city limit signs. And the Lowell City Council agreed with the feelings that those signs are not very wel-

coming. In a consensus vote at Monday night's regular council meeting, the city council gave staff the go-ahead to work on having the signs created and installed. The council agreed with the planning commission to have the signs created by DeRuiter Woodcraft, with an estimated cost of the project around \$8,255. "DeRuiter did the signs for the city's cemeteries and has received high praise for the work," said city manager David Pasquale.



# FAMILY HISTORY CARVED IN BEECH TREE

•••• Allan Davidson returned to Quantico, VA where he found the tree still standing that still bears the names of his great grandfather and father.

Allan Davidson was pretty sure that if civilization hadn't gotten it, probably mother

He attended a reunion for the members of the 484th Bomb Group Association in early September at Falls Church, VA.

It is 35 miles north of Quantico, the location of a beech tree which had the names of both his great-grandfather and his father carved in it.

"I didn't think there was a hope in the world that I'd find the tree, but being so close I had to look," Davidson said.

The Bovina, New York native had two things in his favor - a written map left by hisfather and, unbeknownst to Davidson, the location of the tree was now a part of Prince William Forest National Park.

"That kept civilization away," he re-

However, there was still mother nature. Davidson's great-grandfather J.R. Hoys joined Company E 144th Regiment New York State Volunteers in 1862.

"It must have been a fit of patriotism," Davidson said. "My great-grandfather was 31 and had two daughters and a son (all under the age of five)."

Hoys fought in the First Battle of Manassas in the summer of 1861 and in the Second Battle of Manassas in August of

Manassas was 15 miles north of

"At some point in his Army career, he carved his name (J.R. Hoys) in the bark of a beech tree in Quantico," Davidson ex-

Next to Hoys' name was that of his buddy, J. Murray.

Approximately 55 years later, Davidson's father, Hoys' grandson (H.F. Davidson) joined the Marine Corps. Boot camp was in Paris Island, South Carolina.

From there, H.F. Davidson was sent to a marine base located in Quantico for a couple of months before leaving for France. During his short stay in Quantico, Davidson and a buddy were out in the

countryside when they ran across a beech tree with names carved in it. Davidson recognized the name of his grandfather. As was customary for Davidson, he logged his daily activity in his diary.

For Nov. 11 his father wrote, "Pete Wood and I took a hike to Dumfries and found an old pyrite mine. Near the mine was an old beech tree with the names of J.R. Hoys and J. Murray carved in the bark. Pete and I put our names on the opposite side of

"I heard stories about this through the years from my dad," Allan Davidson said. "He died in 1987. After his death I found a beech tree in Quantico, VA. hand-drawn map, amongst many of his papers, detailing the location of the beech

Davidson's written instructions read From Dumfries follow the bed of an old narrow gauge railroad - the rails and ties removed- to old mine dump - cross brook and follow dirt road past two shacks until Fords Creek and find tree in right opposite

"On the back side of the paper was the date 1919," Allan Davidson said. "That was the year my father, my mother and my dad's mother made a trip to Quantico to see the tree. I believe that is when he wrote up the

During his stay for the reunion,

There is often less danger in the things we fear than in the

Davidson traveled the 35 miles to Quantico. There he met up with police Lt. Charles Reed who connected him with the owner of the old

They followed the old railroad to the mine dump, crossed the creek and headed back toward town where they came to Spring

From there, Davidson was advised to ask Prince William Forest park rangers if they would help him continue his journey in search of this beech tree which may or may not still

The rangers dug out an old topographical map to check for the location of a second creek (the south fork of Quantico Creek).

The rangers and Davidson then hopped in a four-wheeler and drove out to the creek's

"We crossed it and there stood the tree It stuck right out," Davidson said, "There were a number of names on it."

Only a few of the letters of Davidson's great-grandfather and father remained. "I could only make out some of the

letters," Davidson said. Enough, though, that Davidson was sure he had the right tree.

"I was very pleased to find the tree still standing," Davidson said.

Did he carve his name in it? No! " would have, but rangers take a dim view of people carving up trees."

# Approved drug policy maintains city's federal and state compliance

To keep in federal and state compliance, the Lowell City Council unanimously approved an anti-drug and alcohol abuse policy at its regular Monday night meeting.

City manager David Pasquale said the policy was largely to meet federal and state regulations, which now require municipalities to have such policies on their books.

"The policy is specifically geared for those who hold commercial driver's licenses and other safety-sensitive positions," Pasquale said. "Those people are placed in a random drug program, which is conducted by an outside agency." According to staff, names of Lowell staff members are mixed in with others for different municipalities with so many names being drawn out of the pool per year to be tested.

The policy itself is designed to reflect the Michigan's Public Act 265 of 1995 and the Federal Highway Administration Technical Rule Amendments of March 8, 1996. The policy states that the city acknowledges that alcohol and drug abuses in the workplace reflect a national problem and that the city intends to provide an alcohol and drug-free environment. To do this, the city has implemented the following procedures

The amended ordinance, recommended by the Lowell Planning Commission, provides for city businesses to display signs, banners and flags outside their building for 21 days of the year. This is independent of flags and signs being displayed for religious, state or national holidays.


Thayer scored his only touchdown of the evening in the plays with Bellechasses taking it into the end zone on a one-




Lowell runningback Steve VanLaan is off to the races. The junior raced past Northview defenders on a 40-yard


Forest Hills Central's soccer team is considered by many to be the best in West Michigan.







# Journey to success - requires fact finding, decision making, attitude and belief in one's self

Editor's Note: This is the second of four articles addressing goal-setting, motivation, visualization, success and balance in one's daily life.

Worse than being blind would be to be able to see but not have any vision. HELEN KELLER

The gallant and inspirational woman of Tuscumbia. AL, could not see, but her ability to visualize helped her realize many worthwhile predetermined personal goals. History books write of Keller's inner strength and

personal successes which she was able to realize. Keller ridded herself of the unsatisfied feeling one might associate with being blind by taking control and taking steps to overcome it.

Tonia North, a representative with Growth Through People Inc., said success is determined by what a person is willing to do to find out and achieve it.

"Success is a journey - not a destination," North explains. "It is a progressive realization of worthwhile, predetermined, personal goals."

The journey to success requires decisions and finding out information as well as attitude and belief in one's self. "These decisions do not come about like a lightning bolt," North said. "A person has to have the belief that he/

she can do it." The realization of personal goals (success) is achieved through time-management, self - motivation, self- confi-

dence, and good communication skills. People don't "plan to fail"; they "fail to plan" is more truth than adage.

"We tend not to focus on goals because of stress, procrastination, lack of planning, and lack of self-confidence, and we don't track our progress," North said. "How successful would businesses be without goals?" Conditioning also plays a key role. "We talk to our-

selves. Our minds are like computers; what we feed into them is what we get out of them," said North. How can people change this? North suggests writing down one's goals, reading about areas of interest, or using

statements of how someone would like to be. She says the changes won't happen overnight. "It takes a minimum of 21 days to recondition one's self and to change one's habits."

and writing daily, positive present- tense (affirmation)

North believes people need to use the same level of expectation in the area of realization of personal goals as people do with walking and driving.

"We expect that our children will be able to walk and talk. That same attitude, mind set, is needed in our daily journey to success and/or realization of goals," North explains.

How important is goal- setting to success? North believes one has to look no further than a 17-year study which shows that three percent of the people are wealthy, 10 percent are financially independent, 60 percent are paycheck to paycheck, and 27 percent who are on welfare/government

The study showed that the three percent had written, clear goals, the 10 percent set goals but were not as thorough, the 60 percent had goals in mind but did not write them down, and the 27 percent lived day to day and had no goals.

The conclusion is a direct relationship between financial status and how specific one is with their goals.

"Many people are not happy with their current lives, but do not believe in their abilities enough to change it," North said. "Again, it is conditioning. It's knowledge and what a person has learned from his/her parents, school systems, peers, friends and co-workers.'

Dick Korb, associate superintendent of Iwoell Schools, believes in the importance of articulating and writing down "My parents instilled that in me, but because they were my

parents, I never gave it credibility," Korb said. It was his grandmother and later his high school coach who sold him on positive thinking. "My grandmother was positive

and enthusiastic. She instilled in us the idea that we could do what we set our mind to," Korb said. "She was the only teacher in a one-room school house; she was an assessor, a county tax collector and a driving force on a 120- acre cattle farm."

Korb's social studies teacher/football coach was also very much into setting goals. He believed it provided drive and impetus to go out and achieve. "I learned from him that goal-setting was a way to establish meaning and purpose in one's life, job and family."

While Korb is a firm believer in goal- setting, he said it is not for everyone. It can't be forced. It's a personal thing - it must click inside.

While North agrees goal- setting can't happen overnight, it is something that can be learned. "People don't use it because they lack the knowledge and understanding of how powerful goal-setting is," she says.

Since Korb began his professional career in education, he types goals for each year and hangs them up in his office where he can see them everyday.

"I do this for my professional and personal life. It provides me with a road map and keeps me focused," Korb said, "although I'm not consumed with it and I'm not afraid of not reaching goals I've set. If goals have been too lofty, then I reassess.

North said she believes educators and parents need more exposure. Demands are getting higher and many of these concepts will lower stress and increase performance. "Educators and parents are no different than the average population and many do not realize the power of goalsetting. Kids will only do what they are exposed to."

Korb responds that he thinks it is the responsibility of every teacher to help students realize their potential and

"The school has no general policy in this area. The good teachers make a commitment to help every student realize their potential. Those who don't are not worth their salt,"

FMB State Savings Bank president and CEO Jim Bosserd said the Franklin Planner got him started with goal-setting. "It forces you to look ahead - personally, financially, spiritually and in business," he said. "I take five minutes each day to review and remind myself of what I want to

Bosserd said his father drove him to work hard and to set goals. The FMB president and CEO said goal- setting is a function of one's personality.

# Preliminary pool report discussed

The URS Greiner feasibility study provided a preliminary report on the possibilities available when considering a Lowell community swimming pool.

The study was presented to officials from Lowell and Vergennes townships, the city of Lowell, Lowell Schools and the YMCA.

Areas covered in the preliminary study were site and building evaluation, pool configuration, project costs and financing options.

"The feasibility study just provided us with ideas," said YMCA director Andy Johnson.

While the information provided a rudimentary beginning, Lowell superintendent Bert Bleke cautioned that the community doesn't have to be limited to that thinking. "It is data which can be manipulated," he said.

An all-inclusive study group, which will include representatives from all the political units and a cross section of citizens, is being formed to explore a number of areas. They would include the purpose of the pool, cost analysis, loca-said

tion, maintenance and upkeep and alternative funding. Bleke said this would be done over a five- to six-

month period. "After that, we will be in a position to make recommendations and determine the necessity and if there will be support," he said. "We all need to play together and come to a consensus agreement.'

Johnson said he felt the community had a need for a pool and that the community has the ability to support some type of pool.

Lowell Township supervisor John Timpson said he does not have a problem with the concept of a community pool, but has concerns with the numbers.

"There is nothing worse than getting into something you can't handle or are not comfortable with." Timpson
