

Karp condo project stalls

"We can only approve what comes across our desks, and we haven't seen anything," said vice chair Richard Bryan at the April 13 Lowell Charter Township Planning Commission meeting.

He was alluding to the lack of paperwork needed to finalize plans for the Cumberland Springs condominium project proposed by developer Tom Karp.

The project has stalled because Karp has not yet amended his plans to meet the stipulations of the planning commission. No public hearing date for its approval can be set until the requirements are met.

Currently, the commission is awaiting the engineer's plans for the project's groundwork as well as appropriations for drainage, fencing, water retention, and storm water runoff.

"Without these changes, approval won't be granted [for the proposed condominiums]," explains Bryan. "When the changes are submitted, we'll consider them.

City considers participating in county's gypsy moth suppression program

For the first time, the city of Lowell may actually spray for gypsy moths.

City manager David Pasquale said the issue came up at the request of Lowell Charter Township, which has participated in the Kent County Gypsy Moth Suppression Program for a few years. The township received information from program officials indicating that not only parts of the township needed spraying, but also areas in the city, where some residents have petitioned for spraying.

This information was passed on to the city and Pasquale presented it to the city council at its regular board meeting last week.

The council plans to discuss the spraying at its upcoming council meeting set for 7:30 p.m. April 20 at the Englehardt Library. The city

CITY OF LOWELL **SPRING LEAF PICKUP PROGRAM**

Starting the third and fourth weeks of April, leaves will be picked up by Denny's Disposal. You must purchase leaf bags at the same locations as the trash bags:

City Hall Family Fare Supermarket

Hahn's Hardware Lowell 66 (formerly Phillips 66)

These bags are sold in lots of 20 for \$5.00. They hold 30 gallons and are made of a paper, biodegradable material. The leaves are taken to a compost area.

This is a leaf composting program. Leaves, yard waste and twigs up to 2" in diameter may be placed in the leaf bags. The composting operation cannot accept leaves in plastic bags.

If your trash pickup is Monday or Tuesday, your leaf pickup day is Tuesday, April 14 or 21. If your pickup for trash is Wednesday or Thursday, your leaf pickup is Wednesday, April 15 or 22.

Also, the leaf pick up program will continue the first Tuesday and Wednesday of each month from May to November!





As part of my annual evaluation, I asked our staff and many parents several questions. Among them was, "What is one thing that I, as Superintendent, should stop doing?" Among the suggestions I received was to stop putting so much emphasis on the MEAP and the HSPT examinations. Some staff and parents feel that this emphasis is placing children under too much stress and that there is more to a child's education than mere high test scores.

Of course, this criticism is correct. High test scores by themselves are not the end all of education nor should they ever be. Conversely, it is important for staff, parents, and students to understand why our district's vision places such emphasis on these tests.

Few would argue the importance of high, consistent standards and expectations for both our schools and our students. Our students deserve and should expect a highly competent and competitive education that will maximize their preparation for their future. To best provide this opportunity for students, the Lowell Area Schools has developed a clear, concise vision and focus that holds both schools and students accountable. The MEAP and HSPT examinations are our most significant measuring devices.

All coaches and music teachers prepare their students by

practicing the critical skills and knowledge necessary to win an athletic event or perform well in a concert. The coaches and teachers as well as the students are focused. They understand what needs to be practiced on a daily basis in order to be successful. So too should our students be focused as they progress daily through the K-12 curriculum. Our students must work systemically on the knowledge and skills necessary both to do well in the MEAP and HSPT examinations but more importantly in their preparation for their future careers and life.

The Lowell Area Schools has worked hard to coordinate a sound K-12 curriculum and instructional practices that coordinate the learning activities for students. There exists a clear relationship between daily instruction, the MEAP examinations, and the skills and knowledge necessary for our students to be successful in life.

Why are test scores important? Certainly not for the sake of high test scores - but because these tests do reflect the skills and knowledge necessary for our students to succeed in later life. This then is our true vision - successful children who become successful adults. The MEAP and HSPT tests are merely a way to help us gage our success, our progress, and our need for continuous growth to help all of our children succeed.

ANTIBIOTICS

Often a patient will call the office requesting a prescription for an antibiotic over the phone for a cold or other illness. We usually politely decline the request, suggesting that if the patient is sick enough to need an antibiotic, they really should be examined in order to make a proper diagnosis and offer treatment recommendations.

Antibiotics are strong medications that have proven invaluable throughout the years in stopping infections and saving lives. Antibiotics should not be prescribed indiscriminately. They should only be used to combat bacterial infections. They have absolutely no place in the treatment of viral

The overuse and abuse of antibiotics over the years has lead to bacterial resistance and serious infections which can be very difficult to treat. When you don't complete a full course of antibiotics, you increase the risk of harboring resistant

Antibiotics are generally safe medications, but side effects and serious allergic reactions can and do occur. There-

fore, antibiotics should only be taken when they are necessary. Colds and the flu are caused by viruses and they should not be treated with antibiotics unless complications such as pneumonia or sinusitis occur. Most sore throats are also due to a virus. Unless a sore throat is due to strep documented by a throat swab, antibiotics are not usually indicated. Most ear

infections are due to bacterial causes and will usually require antibiotic treatment. Sinus infections and bronchitis may be caused by bacteria or a virus so your doctor may treat these infections with an antibiotic Don't expect antibiotics to cure every illness. Most viral

upper respiratory infections will take one to two weeks to run their course.



especially oaks, birch, aspen, poplar, and willow. The caterpillars not only strip trees of their leaves but also the caterpillar's frass and decaying bodies can cause a nuisance in picnic areas. recreation areas, and backyards. According to a report from the Michigan State University Extension, people living where gypsy moth populations are high can experience skin or eye rashes or allergies due to caterpillar hairs.

To control the gypsy moth population, the Kent County Gypsy Moth Suppression Program uses the microbial insecticide. Bacillus thuringiensis or Bt. Bt is a bacterium found naturally on leaves and in the soil. In the 1900s, scientists discovered when caterpillars ate Bt, the insects stopped eating

Microbial insecticides such as Bt kill only certain insects They are harmless to people, other animals, and even most insects, and usually break down quickly and don't build up in

Spraying for gypsy moths usually takes place in late May/ early June throughout the entire county. The precise date is determined when the caterpillar eggs hatch and the eating cycle begins. Bt is most effective when the caterpillars are

If the city should decide to join the Kent County Gypsy Moth Suppression Program, residents in the area to be sprayed will be notified 24 hours in advance of the spraying.

Stevens wins West Michigan Regional Competition's "Best of Show"

Jurying the 12th annual West Michigan Regional Area Arts Council was a reality check for Jose Narezo.

Most of the 54 juried works were based in realism.

"The work that was submitted for this exhibition was all at a very high level of awareness." Narezo explained. "The task was very

difficult because of the very diverse methods, content matter, and traditional versus progressive issues in application."

Narezo, a Grand Rapids artist and art educator, had 215 entries to choose from. He narrowed it down to 54 for the competition. "An artist...not only is to see the acceptance as approval but to stay alert in keeping him or her challenged. Exclusion does not mean to deny your work, but to get stronger and try harder to make them erroneous."

There were five that stood out for Narezo.

Rick Stevens' "Long Lake in Fall" oil painting earned Best of Show and a check for \$500.

Stevens sold the painting prior to the competition. "I asked the buyer if he would mind if I hung onto the painting a little longer so I could enter it into the competition," he explained.

Stevens sat up at Long Lake in Sparta last fall and composed a 12 by 15 inch study of the location. He liked the composition so much and the way the brush captured the trees that he decided to enlarge the work.

Larry Blovits' pastel "Spruce Flats Falls" was rewarded with Best 2-D and a check for \$300.

Samantha Cotterill's untitled ceramic work earned Best 3-D and a check for \$300.

Carole Lende-Svec's mixed media entitled "Rough Seas" was deemed the Most Creative Use of Materials and received a check for \$200.

Molly Alicki-Corriveau's

sculpture (ink on paper) entitled "One is for Bad News" was Juror's Choice and was rewarded with a check for \$200.

David Davis, LAAC director, explained that there were many works of landscapes and things easily recognized. "The color in this year's pieces was another strong point."

The West Michigan Regional Competition awarded \$1,500 in total prizes. The


prizes were all underwritten.

The \$1,400 in proceeds from the event will go toward operation of the LAAC.

"It was a challenge to put the show together," Davis said. "When it came time to hang the 54 pieces of work, everything seemed to fit like a glove."


