•••• The Main Street bridge/sluiceway project scheduled to take nearly two months was completed in nearly a month.

With a month still remaining on its contract to finish the bridge/sluiceway work on Main Street, Kamminga & Roodvoets Inc. (K&R) reported what many did not think was possible just two months ago.

"We expect to finish the project on Wednesday (June 3)," said K&R's Pat Bishop.

The paving of the south side of the bridge on Wednesday will mark the completion of the project approximately one month earlier than scheduled.

"I'm real happy," said Rupert's Drop owner Deb Pike. "This is a pleasant surprise. I thought by the way they were moving, it might get done early. I will be real happy when I see them remove those orange hurdles."

Bishop said K&R was aware of the construction problems the city went through a couple of years ago. "K&R has a reputation of catering to the public and

### "Demolition by Neglect" regulation gets council's vote of approval

With the support it received from the Lowell City Council, additional funds will be available to Lowell's Historic District to carry out "demolition by neglect" cases.

The process will help prevent downtown buildings from incurring the same fate as the old Christiansen Drug Store building. It was torn down nearly a year ago as a result of neglect.


"The additional funds might be called working capital," says historic district board

member Jim Doyle. "They will be used to carry out exterior building repairs. The funds will come back to the city through the repayment of a tax lien."

The ordinance adopted by the city council will give the Lowell Historic District committee persuasion over building owners to repair their buildings.

A key point in the process is that repairs in an amount greater than the value of the building will become true costs of the city while repair costs that are less than the value

### AN OPEN LETTER TO THE LOWELL BOARD OF EDUCATION

The "Lack of Vision" Award goes to the high school administration this year.

Imagine you are the parent of a high school student who has worked very hard all year to achieve a big goal. Imagine perhaps that this is finally the end of the time period and the student is about to be acknowledged for his/her achievement. Now imagine that prior to the achievement award you, as parent, are told that this ceremony is going to be held at a time that you are at work, and that you are informed of this one working day prior to the award. Now imagine that your student is a senior and will be recognized for all four years of achievement but again you are told about it one or two days ahead and it is during work time.

This is exactly what happened to the Academic Achievement Award ceremony this year. Parents were left entirely out of the picture, awards were presented over three days during what should have been class time, and parents were notified of this Friday, May 22 - that the ceremonies were Tuesday, May 26.

When I called to complain I was told that there had been too many people at last year's award dessert, and so the "committee" had decided to do things this way. As far as I could ascertain, the "committee" consisted of the youth development coordinator and one administrator. (Parents were mentioned but I could never get an answer of who they were.) Another parent was told that there were so many students that were "nearly" honor status, so that they needed more time for the ceremony. Another parent was told that students didn't show up for the evening awards so they decided to do it during the day. (Explain how #1 and #3 go together for me, please.)

Now lately the story is that the school didn't know who was eligible until the last minute. It seems to me that we the taxpayers just spent \$1,100,000 on technology and computer software that was supposed to be able to tell the office "anything they need." And they couldn't figure out who was on the honor roll as of March!!! Perhaps the administration should be handled by a private company instead of spending \$1,878,618; as well as get things straight.

Now imagine again that your student is an athlete, and a star. You as parent are informed that there will not be a (sport) banquet this year, that the students will get a piece of paper during a school assembly, that their name will just be listed among hundreds of others in the paper, and oh yes, you find out one or two days prior to the last week of school. Sound preposterous? It seems that sports NEVER get ignored or banquets "too big." Show me a sports banquet that was ever canceled, or held during the day when parents couldn't come.

I would like to remind the High School and the Board of Education where priorities lie. Are we here to make athletic stars out of our children, or competent, educated adults?? Are parents dispensable, as we certainly seem to be treated? Are all decisions about honors made and carried out by a small committee without consulting anyone who might be involved? The answer to that one can be referred to the letter written about the kindergarten end of the education process, and how parents were consulted (not) on that issue also.

You seem to forget very readily that in this day we, as parents and students, are clients and customers, and not indentured servants. The Board of Education needs to be involved in mandating educational excellence, not just minimum competence. If you are waiting for the administration to do that, you are wasting your time and that of our students. At least, reward those who do well in academics and raise the standard of what that means.

Please convey my regards, congratulations, and apologies to the seniors of this year, whose parents will never get to sit in the auditorium and proudly watch their son or daughter be acknowledged for their hard work. Please convey that the community still is proud of them for their academic achievement also, even though the school did not choose to let us be there.





But there is another measure of success that does not receive as much attention, but is equally important in assessing how well a school is meeting educational objectives. Our vision in the Lowell Schools is to maximize the learning potential of each student, not just those at the top of the academic ladder.



Minimal science requirements have also changed with the new basics requiring biology, chemistry, physics and natural science.

One of my colleagues, Senator Mike Rogers, R-Howell, has sponsored legislation passed by the Senate to help young people ease through these heightened expectations by em-

His proposal which has been sent to the Michigan House of Representatives—SB 1109—would allow high school iuniors and seniors to attend and get credit for today's high tech vocational education classes at the local community

The community colleges around the state have become service centers for those trying to ready themselves for the new job world. With this legislation, high schoolers would be able to jump start the process with the administrative and financial support of their local school district.

Two other related bills—SB 1110 and 1111—lift the cap on the number of vocational training charter schools and permit high school students to spend limited amounts of time "shadowing" workers in various jobs, giving them opportunities to sample various occupations.

These bills are just a small part of the effort to develop Michigan's workforce for the future.

So how are we doing in educating those students who in past years have not been as successful learners? The news is very good. During the past four years, the percentage of Lowell students scoring "low" on the fourth-grade reading test shrank the "low" performance category. The Lowell schools are from 20.8 percent to only 6.5 percent this year. On fourthgrade math, those scoring low went from 10.2 percent to only 1.7 percent in 1998. In seventh-grade reading, low scores declined from 24.5 percent in 1994 to 8.4 percent this year, and in seventh-grade math from 10.4 percent to 1.2 percent. These they are doing to bring educational opportunity to all of our are impressive results. It means that we are doing a better job of assuring that our curriculum reaches all students and that all of our young people are being given a solid start as they move on to higher education or into the work force.

So when you read a report about the MEAP results and the "competition" among area districts, keep in mind that the real important message may lie in the fewer number of students in performing very well in this regard, and we are proud that our curriculum is successfully reaching increasing numbers of students. 



A bill was passed by Congress entitling Veterans to a dividend of the GI Insurance they had while in the service. Both current and former military personnel are entitled to this dividend regardless of whether or not they still carry the insurance. If you are eligible, you will not receive this dividend unless you ask for it. The Veteran's Administration will review each individual case and determine eligibility. A general schedule of dividend earned is as follows:

2 years of service: \$261.00 3 years of service: \$391.00

4 years of service: \$528.00

To apply for dividend write to:





From a safe distance, so as not to harm the bird's nest camouflaged among the cattails, Alto students of Jim Kovach's fourth-grade class peer through the chutes, as they stand on the pond's bank at the Alto Elementary Outdoor Science micro-organisms. classroom.

The site is a prime example of animal adaptation, a point of study in their current science lesson.

Students are studying how animals use body covering, body parts and behavior to survive in their environment. Kovach points out how the camouflaged nest is an

example of that.

Through a coordinated effort with high school advanced biology and ecology teacher Bob Garcia, Kovach has his students teaming up with high school juniors and seniors to conduct dissolve- oxygen tests, map out measurements of the pond's depth, and use a plankton net so that they can study

"The nice thing about the pond here at Alto is it is older and gives you a better picture of pond life," Garcia said. "Between the grant Jim got for equipment and what I have at the high school, we can do a better job of analyzing what is

D. Lee Fund. The Parks and Recreation Commission NAY: 0. and City Council adopted a policy to ensure at least \$1,000 or 10% of net proceedings would be set aside toward building a fund reserve to gain greater investment revenue. Two pavilions are planned for Creekside and Stoney Lakeside Parks. There will be one 20 x 24 structure at each park by the current fiscal year end. An additional pavilion and more parking will be installed at Creekside Park during the coming budget year. An allocation of \$4,800 is provided for design services to Recreation Park improvements as part of reviewing access to the facility. King Milling Company will donate \$5,000 for this study.

Councilmember Green responded that the City needs to ensure public access along the riverbank from the train tracks to the mouth of the Flat River. The City still wants to meet the needs of King Milling.

Councilmember Blough requested the Downtown Historic District Commission to give the City a report on IT WAS MOVED BY BLOUGH and seconded by current properties in need of exterior repairs. If the properties are not repaired and the Historic District Commission wants to have any leverage, monies will have to be allocated to undertake the repair. There is a process where the owner will be billed for those improvements. At YEA- 4 this time, the budget has not earmarked any funds for this NAY: 0. fiscal year.

Pasquale responded there are concerns in having monies allocated in case the Historic District Commission needs to exercise its authority. Jim Doyle stated the Commission has applied to the Lowell Area Community Fund (Englehardt Trust) for assistance. If this should not materialize, the City will consider funding. Also, Downtown Historic District Commissioner James Barber will report on downtown building repairs at the next public Vergennes. The property fronts Vergennes Road and hearing.

Mayor Thompson closed the public hearing.

Mayor Thompson commented that a copy of the budget is available for public review.

Item #2. REVIEW OF A PROPOSED TREE REMOVAL

AT 829 N. JEFFERSON Pasquale stated the City did receive a quote from Poortenga Tree Service of \$1,300 to remove the tree at 829 N. Jefferson. Director of Public Works Dan DesJarden responded Poortenga crew examined the tree. The tree is very healthy, but no grass can grow in the area since the size causes shading. The tree is pushing the concrete wall very little as indicated. DesJarden noted it is on the City right of way.



Prostate cancer is receiving a remarkable amount of attention in the news media of late - and for good reason. In 1997, 210,000 cases of prostate cancer were diagnosed, and more than 40,000 deaths were attributed to this malignancy.

Prostate cancer may be manifested by the same symptoms noted with benign enlargement of the prostate gland - decreased strength of the urinary stream, sensation of not having completely emptied the bladder, waking up several times at night to urinate. In most men, however, prostate cancer has NO symptoms until it becomes very advanced.

Because of the relative lack of symptoms of prostate cancer, screening remains very important as a tool for early diagnosis. Screening consists of a digital rectal exam to feel the prostate. If it is firm, asymmetric, or nodular, it is considered suspicious for malignancy. A PSA blood test should then be obtained to further screen the patient. An annual PSA test is only indicated for men over 50, unless the patient is black or has a family history of prostate cancer; in those cases, an annual PSA is recommended starting at age 40.

If the gland is suspicious (abnormal digital exam or elevated PSA), then an ultrasound and a biopsy are recommended to rule out cancer. If cancer is found on biopsy, many forms of treatment are available, depending on the stage of the disease and the age and overall health of the patient. In any event, we cannot overemphasize the need for regular screening for prostate disease.



### Sunny spot for flowers; hard to go wrong with geraniums

hanging basket or patio container, the National Garden Bureau says it's hard to beat geraniums.

"They're hard to beat but easy to care for," says Mary McLellan, Master Gardner program coordinator at Michigan State University. A site that receives at least six hours of full sun daily, a well-drained soil and regular watering and fertilizing are the keys to good luck with geraniums, she says.

Choosing which ones to plant may be the most difficult part. Single semidouble and double-flowered cultivars in white, pink, salmon, red, lavender, rose, coral and bicolors; plants with scented leaves and fragrant flowers; ivy-leafed types ideal for hanging baskets and windowboxes; and plant

For summer-long color in a sunny garden, windowbox, heights ranging from dwarf to tall are some of the options.

Look for healthy, dark green leaves free of spots, yellowing or pests and compact plants. Plant them at the same depth or a little deeper than they were growing in the cell pack or pot. Geraniums in beds and borders should be spaced 8 to 12 inches apart. In containers, they combine well with dusty miller, lobelia, petunias and other sun-loving annuals.

Geraniums prefer a rich soil with good drainage and a fair amount of organic matter. Heavy feeders, they'll need fertilizing every two to four weeks with a balanced water-soluble fertilizer such as 10-10-10 or 20-20-20. An alternative is to apply a time-release fertilizer at planting.

containers daily and water if it's dry to a depth of two inches or more. Mulching plants in beds and borders will help conserve soil moisture and control weeds, McLellan suggests.

Geraniums are relatively pest free, but a couple of diseases can become garden problems. Botrytis, an airborne fungal disease that appears when days are warm, nights are cool and plants are dripping with dew in the morning, causes flowers to mold and turn to brown mush. At the first sign of moldy flowers, remove the whole blossom or, if necessary, the whole

Xanthomonas, a bacterial disease, can be carried into the garden on infected plants. One of the early symptoms is leaf spotting; lower leaves eventually turn yellow and then brown but don't drop off. The plant then wilts as the bacteria plug up the plant's vascular system, preventing water from moving up the stems from the roots. Then the plant dies. The only treatment is to dispose of infected plants.

As fall approaches, plants can be lifted from the garden. cut back and potted, or cuttings can be started for growing indoors over the winter. To encourage compact growth and promote flowering, McLellan recommends using fluorescent fixtures to supplement natural light.
