### Tim Wittenbach wows township electorate; wins primary

•••• The first contested Vergennes Township supervisor election since 1984 did not disappoint, as a record number (1,006) of township residents voted in Tuesday's election primary.

It was Tim Wittenbach's first political race.

One, however, proved not to be such a lonely number for the winner of the Vergennes Township supervisor primary election Tuesday night.

Wittenbach garnered 56 percent of the voter turnout as he easily outdistanced Vergennes Township interim supervisor Marsha Wilcox and challenger Richard Dwyer.

Wittenbach tallied 568 votes. Wilcox collected 334 and Dwyer garnered seven votes. There were 10 write-ins and two over votes.

"I wasn't nervous earlier, but now I am," said Wittenbach after learning that he had won the primary. I am very happy that I won"

Wittenbach ran an aggressive ad campaign in his pursuit of the supervisor seat... ads which included the support of Vergennes Township resident and state representative Jack Horton. His message for broad resident ran on the premise of change," Wittenbach explained. "This is

"Throughout his campaign Wittenbach was passionate about Vergennes Township, its growth and that improvement be beneficial to everybody. He promised that he would remain sensitive to the wants and needs of the people.

"I don't know what pushed the election in my favor, but I

Al Baird, former planning commissioner, campaigned heavily for Wittenbach and was pleased with the vote's message. "The people have spoken. They were unhappy with the way things were. I believe Tim will be honest and will work for the people in this township."

Vergennes Township resident Bill Schreur Jr., who had conflicts with the township over the last four months, said the people learned the truth and came out in force and showed they wanted change. "They sent a loud message. The results give me hope for the future."

Wilcox, who was not in attendance at the township when the results were announced, was not available for comment.

"Mr. Wittenbach and his campaigners ran a fierce race. I congratulate him on his win. I look forward to getting to know him better," said Vergennes Township clerk Mari

### Police and city sign three-year deal

•••• Lowell police officers will receive a 3.5 percent wage increase in year one of the new three-year contract.

Negotiations of a threeyear agreement between the Lowell Police Officers Association and the city of Lowell went beyond the timeline, but both sides were content with the agreement presented for approval to the Lowell City Council.

"The agreement took longer because of negotiations and discussion over wording," said Lowell police chief Jim Valentine. "The negotiations are very informal. The association presents a wish list and the city counters."

The major items of the contract renewal include:

 A 3.5 percent wage increase for the department's five police officers and its sergeant during the first year of the new contract. Wage re-openers are in place for the second and third years.

 A provision of \$20 per shift for officers who are assigned as field training officers and function to train and evaluate employees.

 A \$60 per year increase in longevity payments (a maximum of \$600).

· The need for notification to the association if insurance and benefit levels change.

· Providing a re-opener for discussion involving legal representation and liability insurance concerning police officers.

The city's zoning board of appeals' (ZBA) reversal of a planning commission recommendation, in regards to a rear yard setback, may have been that "one too many."

"I don't like being the guy wearing the black hat all the time and that's what is happening," said Lowell Planning commissioner Jim Hall.

The commissioner recommended that paperwork be

submitted to city attorney Richard Wendt for a legal opinion as to whether the zoning board of appeals is operating within the law or the guidelines set.

"Article 20 in the zoning ordinance states the criteria for zoning board of appeals to follow. If it is operating outside of the ordinance, that is one thing. If we should change the ordinance, that is another," Hall said.

Some advocate increased emphasis on math and science education, while others argue for the humanities and the arts. With this in mind, the U.S. Department of Education has developed a set of national priorities for educational improvement. Here are some of the key goals:

That's it. When I finally figured out what had happened. I finished sharpening my blades and went back to mowing. During its growth, it too has changed. That is evident as the 64th annual Kent County 4-H Youth Fair is set to commence next week.


For Wenger, who has served as president for the past eight years, would have it no other way.

In conjunction with the horse leaders, the fair board has constructed new box stalls. Wenger believes the renovation work will increase the use of the horse arena during the




