Township residents to absorb a 22 cent hike in water rates

•••• Lowell Charter Township water customers who previously paid \$2.67 per 1,000 gallons will now be charged \$2.89.

Attention, Lowell Charter Township: your water rates are on the rise!

ter Township's water use combined with the city manufacturing less water while selling more will result in a 22 cent increase in township residents' water rates.

Last year Lowell Township used 12 percent of the water produced by the city. This year it used 15 percent.

"Actually, the township used the same amount of water as last year, but because the blame the other guy," city produced less water, the amount of water the township used represented a higher percentage of what was sold," said John Timpson, Lowell Township supervisor.

The result is township water customers who previously paid \$2.67 per 1,000 gallons are now being charged \$2.89.

"The township was notified [of the water

rate change] in June," reported Dave Pasquale, city manager of Lowell. Though the new rate has been in place for only a month, Pasquale noted that a meeting of officials was necessary "to explain the facts and figures behind the decision."

Sizeable increase in student enrollment brings "a good thing" for school budget

•••• An additional 59 more students than projected equates to an extra \$252,000. It will help erase a proposed deficit budget.

Each August, in the weeks leading up to the new school year, students and parents are busy shopping for pens, pencils, notebooks, folders and clothes.

This year, the Lowell School District joined them, sort of, as it spent the days leading up to the school year interviewing and hiring new teachers so that it could better on Tuesday.

Through the Stanfred student enrollment projection which the school district uses each year, Lowell was estimated to have 3,601 students.

An influx of people moving into the

district has increased Lowell's projection to 3,660 students for the 1998-99 school year. That is an increase of 59 students.

"Most of the time that number is pretty close, but I remain cautious until I see the whites in the students' eyes," said Connie Gillette, assistant superintendent for finance and personnel. "The increase in the number of students is a good thing."



Repaying of M-21 stretch slows many drivers to a halt

Reith-Riley Construction Company continued with its resurfacing of a two-mile section of M-21, west of Valley Vista Drive to the Kent-Ionia county line.

Motorists incurred intermittent lane closures and traffic delays throughout the days on Monday and Tuesday.

Work crews began rehabilitating M-21 in early May. The project is expected to be completed within the next two-three weeks.

Construction has included new curb. gutter, storm sewer, and water main extensions.

The resurfacing contract is a \$1.3 million project.


"M-21 was badly in need

Lowell Township looks to individuals' insurance companies absorbing some of emergency vehicle use cost

What is the price of safety these days?

That was a question examined by the Lowell Charter Township Board at their regular meeting on August 18. Board members recognized that township costs are skyrocketing for deploying emergency vehicles to expressway accidents, and a policy for these costs needed to be

The board is considering the implementation of a cost recovery ordinance for Lowell Township. This ordinance would regulate fire and rescue arrivals at accident sites along the expressway within the township boundaries. Instead of the township absorbing the emergency vehicle expense, the auto insurance of the cars in the collision would be billed.

"Many of our accident dispatch calls are false alarms, and that costs the township dearly," stated township supervisor John Timpson. "Billing individual insurance could help alleviate costs."

Timpson reported that the current contract for emergencies with the Lowell Township Fire Dept. could be raised annually from \$3,000 to \$25,000, judging from usage charges alone.

Though the township fire squad could not be reached for comment, Timpson remarked that fire chief Frank Martin tipped him off to the increased need for emergency vehicle funding. "After speaking with (Martin), we saw that we'll need to regulate things," Timpson explained. Emergency Vehicles, cont'd. pg. 3

Harley riders will bike into Lowell for fourth annual Toy Run, Sept. 13

The roar of Harvey Davidsons will once again be heard through the city of Lowell as the Fourth annual Toy Run comes to the city Sept. 13.

At its last August board meeting, Doug Morrell, a representative of the group that organizes the Toy Run every year. asked for and received permission for the bike parade to come through Lowell and end at the 4-H Fairgrounds.

"We had an excellent turnout last year," Morrell said adding that it exceeded organizers' expectations.

The Toy Run is in honor of Tony Stevens, who died from cancer at the age of three. Stevens is the son of Dave and Sherry Stevens, of Belding. The Toy Run is designed to collect toys and money used to purchase more toys and wrapping paper. All the toys are then distributed to children in the hospital during the holiday season.

"Last year, Dave and Sherry Stevens were overwhelmed by the support and amount of toys we were able to collect." Morrell said, adding that more than 200 bikes participated in the parade with about 400 people visiting the 4-H Fairgrounds during the day. "It was so much more than what they ex-

This year, Morrell said the group is expecting about 400 bikes in the parade and about 600 to 800 people coming to the fairgrounds. "Everyone who has participated in this has commented on

what a good feeling it gives them in being able to help somebody else," Morrell said.

The parade starts at Riverside Park in Grand Rapids. The bikers, led by Santa Claus and his wife in a converted limo motorcycle, head out to Lowell at noon from Riverside. The ride takes about 45 minutes. The entry fee for the parade is an unwrapped gift (money is also accepted).

The group will be traveling through Lowell at about 1 p.m. with the parade heading straight down Main Street and into the fairgrounds.

the face and scalp as well as the body. In children and adults the mite and rash spare the face. A common area to have intense itching is between the fingers and on the hands. The genital area can be infected.

The female mite burrows into the skin, where she lives for about 30 days, and lays eggs 2-3 per day. The eggs hatch in 3-5 days and the larvae move the surface and develop into adults in 10-14 days. Thus the breeding cycle continues. The mite is barely visible to the naked eye.

Once diagnosed, treatment is available. All household members should be treated the same day to avoid the pingpong effect of new symptomatic cases arising in untreated family members. Great care must be taken to cover the entire skin with the treatment cream. The cream is applied at bedtime stopped. and left on for eight-13 hours and showered off in the a.m. Underwear, clothing, sheets, and towels used the 48 hours before treatment must be laundered. Furniture and other objects are not a concern because the mite lives up to 48 hours at most away from a human host. Stuffed animals and toys can be placed in plastic bags for 48 hours.

Killing of all the scabies mites does not immediately stop mite, symptoms may not be noted until two to six weeks after the itch. It may take as long for the itching to resolve as it did for it to appear. Antihistamines like Benedryl may help to Symptoms include extreme intense itching, usually worse relieve the itch, as well as some moisture may help with the dry scaling skin. When the skin has become red from intense itching, a bacterial infection can sometimes occur, needing antibiotic treatment.







Residents petition to have Montcalm Ave. paved

Could pavement be in the future for Montcalm Avenue? Homeowners along Montcalm Avenue petitioned the Lowell Charter Township Board to pave a portion of the road in their residential sector where traffic is the heaviest. The residents complained that passing cars generate large clouds of road dust which could cause safety hazards for pedestrians.

A 40-name petition was brought before the board at the township's regular board meeting August 18. Discussion ensued about the legalities of paving the requested approximate 1/4-mile stretch of road.

"The Kent County Road Commission is responsible for Montcalm Avenue," township supervisor John Timpson explained at the meeting. "Paving a section of that road would mean the township pays 55 percent of the cost and the road commission pays the other 45 percent.

Such legalities are not obstacles to the process; however, these matters do take time. Timpson reported that a petition places a work order on a list in which requests are filled in the order they are received.

"There are two or three projects in line ahead of Montcalm Avenue, and some of the projects won't be short-lived.' Timpson stated. "It could be four or five years before any pavement can be laid on Montcalm.'







bonfire," Timpson adds.

The township's current rate includes the cost for transmission lines, wells down by the river and the east side of town.

The one element which could help lower the rate for

township customers unfortunately is what is missing.

"More customers on the system would spread the cost over a wider base," Timpson said. "The infrastructure is set up to handle more customers, but that growth hasn't materialized

The township currently has 370 homes on the system. The school, one of the customers, is equivalent to 70 of those homes.

The potential growth Timpson refers to is Foreman Farms development (30 homes); Tom Karp's development (Victoria Springs - 60 homes); and the Gunnick and DeVries development (184 housing sites) and its Stoneridge development (a

96-site apartment complex).

The realization of those developments would considerably affect the price its residents pay for water.

Township officials seem to be taking the water rate increase in stride. Remarked township clerk Carol Wells, "We understand that the water methodology is in place to best serve the community."

Lowell will receive foundation allowance monies for 3,625.50 students.

That figure is reached by taking 40 percent of Lowell's '98 actual February count, 60 percent of its estimated '98 September count and 75 percent of its estimated student migrant count.

The ramifications of an extra \$252,000 are significant. "The district will not have to deficit spend as it projected," said Gillette. In an effort to help with the projected deficit spending, the district was going to roll a CD (valued at \$129,000) into the general fund.

"It now appears we won't have to do that," Gillette said.

"Instead, we are looking to save the money and use it for a special purpose."

Another part of the puzzle that has not yet played out is

what may happen in Lansing.

Prior to the legislature leaving in the spring, there was a two-year proposal to increase the foundation allowance by a couple hundred dollars with schools receiving \$50 of that for this school year and the rest coming in 1999-2000.

Gillette said school districts will just have to wait and see what legislatures decide on.







VERGENNES TOWNSHIP **ORDINANCE 98-4**

The following is an ordinance making allowances for and regulating docks, stairs and boardwalks in the FR (Flat River) District. This ordinance was adopted at a regular meeting of the Vergennes Township Board on August 17, 1998.

Definitions added to Article II, Section 201.202:

SS. River Access Dock - a temporary or permanent appurtenance constructed primarily of natural materials which serves as a landing pier for boats and does not exceed four (4) feet in width, nor sixteen (16) feet in length with no more than four (4) feet extending over the water.

TT. River Access Stairs - a permanent stairway constructed primarily of natural materials on steep slopes to the river where no other environmentally sound access is feasible; which does not cut into the stream bank; which does not exceed four (4) feet in width; which has no landings.

UU. River Access Boardwalk - a permanent walkway constructed primarily of natural materials used to provide access to the river where a marshy area is present, and no other access point is available; which does not exceed four (4) feet in width nor does it exceed the length determined by the Zoning Administrator needed to reach the river's edge.

VV. Permanent Dock, Stairway, Boardwalk - A structure located within the FR District that is attached to the ground or riverbed, and is not intended to be moved seasonally.

WW. Temporary Dock - A landing for riparian access that is located within the FR District, not permanently attached to the riverbed, and is intended to be moved seasonally.

To Article III, Section 201.307, B., add 3., a., b., and c.

3. River Access Docks. Construction of docks along the Flat River is discouraged because of the visual impact to the Natural River and potential hazards to anglers and watercraft users. Vergennes Township regulates permanent structures on land within the Flat River District. Temporary structures in the river itself are also regulated by Vergennes Township with guidance from the Natural Rivers Program Administrator of the Michigan Department of Natural Resources. Permanent structures placed in the river itself are regulated by Vergennes Township with consultation and approval by the Michigan DEQ.

a. River Access Dock. One dock per parcel containing a residence is permitted if necessary to provide safe and ecologically sound access for riparian landowners. A portion of the dock will be constructed within the setback from the river. Owner must obtain a dock and /or building permit from Vergennes Township prior to installation or construction, and may need a permit from the Michigan Department of

individual Quality depending upon Environmental circumstances

- i. Docks constructed on the natural course of the river, or within the No-Wake-Zone where the river is less than 500 feet in width. Construction of docks may not exceed four (4) feet in width, nor sixteen (16) feet in length with no more than four (4) feet extending over the water.
- ii. Docks constructed in the No-Wake Zone. On the portion of the river defined as the "No-Wake Zone", where the river is over five hundred (500) feet in width, the length of temporary docks may be such as to allow access to a river depth of three (3) feet, but not to exceed fifty (50) feet in length. Permanent docks needing to extend over 4 feet in this portion of the river require a permit and review from the Michigan Department of Environmental Quality.
- b. River Access Stairs Stairways are permitted if there is no other safe, feasible, environmentally sound access to the river; one stairway per parcel containing a residence is permitted to be constructed within the setback from the river; using no more than a single handrail if needed for safety; plantings of vegetative material must be established along the sides; must obtain a building permit from Vergennes Township prior to construction.
- c. River Access Boardwalk. One boardwalk per parcel containing a residence is permitted; constructed within the setback from the river; must be low profile without disturbing natural plant and animal habitats; must have no more than a single handrail if needed for safety; must obtain a building permit from Vergennes Township prior to construction, and may need a permit from the Michigan Department of Environmental Quality if constructed within the 100-year flood plain or wetlands.

This Ordinance shall take effect seven (7) days after publication unless a notice of intent to file a referendum is filed within such time, and, if so, then this ordinance shall take effect at such time as is provided by MCLA 125.282, as amended.
