The Lowell Cable Television and Lowell Light and Power have a new look.

Soon residents will see two new logos on vehicles, clothes, stationery, etc. representing the two different departments.

At its Monday night meeting, the Lowell City Council approved two designs created by Fluid Design in Muskegon. The logos are similar in that both have a circle-type design with the

that the companies' old designs were rather outdated. With a fairly competitive market for cable, and light and power services, heads for both departments felt they needed a logo that was a bit more modern and competitive.

Discussions for the new designs came about after a logo was selected for a city flag. The original plan was to use the flag logo to represent the entire city on stationery, vehicles, etc. Debate, however, developed over whether the logo, which features the

While not wanting to detract from the city flag, Myers said he wasn't certain that the flag's logo could be used as a citywide logo. Instead, he wanted to see a more simple cleaner look, perhaps using the Light and Power, and Cable Television designs as a basis for the city logo.

Councilor Jeanne Shores, who was one of the people behind the city flag, said she could accept the designs for the Light and Power and Cable Television, but did feel that the rest of the city should use

"The logo is great as a flag," said councilor Charles Myers, "but to give an example, the American flag is the American symbol, yet the U.S. flag is not what every U.S. government (office) uses on every piece of stationery."

County road and park commission set to begin slow process of developing county park

The rumors have turned out to be true: Kent County Road and Park Commission has made clear its intent to purchase several consecutive parcels of land in Lowell Charter Township for a county park.

At the township's regular board meeting Oct. 19, Roger Sabine, director of parks for Kent County, addressed the board and a large number of township residents. After a short slide presentation, Sabine explained the details of the projected project.

The land the county wishes to acquire is a block of 700 acres on the Grand River with perimeter streets of Alden Nash, Cascade, Segwun, and 36th. Sabine indicated that he has begun the process of notifying all existing landowners in that area of the county's intent to purchase.

"There are 350 of those acres already [in buy-sell agreements]," Sabine stated, "yet we are not trying to move anyone off land who doesn't want to be moved."

The proposed park would include areas for picnicking as well as a playground, baseball diamonds, soccer fields, hiking trails, restrooms, and two designated parking areas. Sabine said that the park would observe dawn-to-dusk hours with staffers on-site during park operation.

Landowners with properties bordering on projected park boundaries voiced their concerns at the meeting. "What about hikers

All six candidates were interviewed for 20 minutes at a special Vergennes Township Board meeting on Sept. 28. Following the interview process, the board voted.

Vandersloot replaces Debbie Rashid who served as Vergennes Township zoning administrator the past two years.







This will be the third, and final, chapter in my Hurricane Georges trilogy. I've covered the preparation and the storm itself. This segment will deal with the storm's aftermath. If you missed the first two parts I'm sure we have copies available at the Ledger office for 35 cents. When I started writing this column over 20 years ago, I'm grateful I had no aspirations of supporting my family with my writing. Takes a lot of 35 cent's to pay a college tuition.

By late in the afternoon of Friday, September 25, Georges had died down to the relative calm of tropical storm force winds. The six- to seven- foot tidal surge we had experienced subsided nearly as fast as it had risen. About 6:00 a pickup truck went slowly past our house, picking its way through the debris and downed wires. The driver was a neighbor who owns a restaurant up on the highway. It seemed strange to see his big green Dodge 4X4, where just an hour or two prior, the street was awash with a couple of feet of seawater. The wind had the have been a windsurfer... not a Dodge.

a look around. I didn't see my shadow, and declared Hurricane considerable work to clear away. Georges officially over in the Florida Keys.

After a couple walk arounds, I concluded that we had been very, very lucky! Our roof was intact, which is more than I could say for many of my neighbors. Ours is a metal roof which, from my observations, held up far better than shingles or tile. When we built the house we chose metal because we like the way it looks with the architecture down here. Even a blind pig finds an acorn once in awhile.

whipped the rain up there, soaked the gypsum board, and down it came. We lost about 25 feet of aluminum gutter and a downspout. Some of the landscaping was damaged from both the wind and the saltwater flood. Some will recover, so it's hard to tell how bad that damage is. The most expensive damage was a central air conditioning unit that was blown from its perch about 10 feet up on the side of the house. It crashed guess is it's junk.

The only other damage was in the kitchen, where some of the drywall on the ceiling was slightly water damaged. The wind drove the rain up the roof and under the ridge cap where it could then leak down. The funny thing about this scenario was where it chose to leak out. We had disassembled all our computers on the main floor and brought them upstairs in case of flooding. The roof leak came out of a light fixture and straight down into the back of an expensive monitor. Funny weird, not funny ha ha. The monitor does seem to be working all right now that it has dried out.

That's it! Our total damage was about \$4,000. Our deductible is \$3,950. Guess what? I still feel lucky. Here's why.

After the brief survey of our minimal damage, Terese and I began to poke around the neighborhood. Almost nobody for several houses up and down the street stayed for the storm. It was very eerie being the only ones out in the mess. And, it was a mess! Trees were down all over. Power lines were down.

Boats were up in yards. All kinds of debris, from chunks of roofing and insulation, to entire hot tubs, was strewn everywhere. It was quite a sight. Worse than my son's room when he

One neighbor had water gushing from a broken outside faucet. Apparently a flying section of board fence hit it. I figured the hardware to be closed, duh, so I couldn't fix the leak. I got a wrench and shut the water off at the street.

Next, I noticed another neighbor's boat was missing. It's a big boat. It's thirty-some feet long with a flybridge and tuna tower. Hard to miss. It had been tied to four by four posts bolted to the concrete seawall, and the posts had snapped off. Terese and I took my scooter and headed down the street. We found Bob's boat about a quarter mile from home and banging against a half million dollar "Black Fin." The other boat had been tied off in the middle of the canal to ride out the storm. It was a good plan until Bob's boat came along.

It was still plenty windy, but we got a couple of lines on Bob's boat and managed to pull it away from the now badly marred "Black Fin." We tied Bob's boat off to a seawall and continued on. Felt like a Boy Scout out doing my good deeds.

We went on down the street for a look out onto US1. It was amazing! As far as we could see in either direction was a relatively neat pile of trash heaped in the middle of the usually busy highway. Boats, docks, hot tubs, storage sheds, lawn furniture, you name it, had floated on the surge to the slightly elevated crown of the highway. There it was stranded when the street whipped up to whitecaps and the vehicle of choice would surge subsided. It was piled so neatly I was reminded of banks of snow left by plow trucks after a big storm up north. > We went to bed that night with no power, phones, mail or cable TV. It would be over a week before we would get these services back. A battery operated radio and a cell phone that worked sporadically for outgoing calls were our only links to the outside world. Still, we felt very lucky.

The following week was filled with dawn to dusk work. We cleaned our mess. We helped neighbors. We helped my motherin-law. She had lost her roof and a wall was blown down in her We lost four short rows of siding on the back of the garage. downstairs enclosure. When the highway was re-opened, I We lost a 4 by 8 foot portion of ceiling on a porch. The wind began a two-day search and rescue mission to salvage the dozens of newspaper distribution boxes we have scattered up and down the Keys. Again, we were lucky, as most are chained to something substantial.

The box detail gave me a chance to survey the damage in the entire Keys. The north wall of Georges' eye passed right over our Key at mile marker 24 (24 miles from the end of the road in Key West). The worst of the damage is confined to a 10- or to the ground and was flooded by a foot or two of seawater. My 15- mile stretch with our house right in the middle. Our home was built after Hurricane Andrew and was engineered to withstand sustained winds up to 130 miles per hour. Also, we happened to be positioned in the lee of the worst of the winds. Our boats, docks and screened porches all faced away from the wind. Plus, our original house was built about three feet higher than most other homes in the neighborhood, so we had no flooding. One neighbor calls our place Mt. Summerland because it is about the highest point on Summerland Key.

All these things made a big difference. One home I saw on Ramrod Key had all of these factors in reverse. They ended up with a 50-foot ketch parked on top of what was left of their house. Again, Terese and I felt very, very lucky ... even guilty for having fared so well.

I realize these columns haven't been as humorous as usual as I've had a lot to report. I'm back in the Keys working on the November issue of our paper. As I write this, there is still a big mess left from Georges. A good percentage of the homes have vinyl tarps for roofs. Some homes are total losses. There are

where are we supposed to practice our passion? This baffles me because it is not fair. The truth of the matter is that skateboarders are stereo typically looked down upon as "bad people," so that is probably one main reason why no one will allow us to skate anywhere, while people that enjoy almost any other activity, have a place to enjoy and practice. 

CHRONIC BRONCHITIS

Chronic bronchitis is a long-term condition involving irritation or inflammation of the bronchial tubes. The inflammation leads to increased mucous production and blockage of the small airways, resulting in coughing and shortness of

Cigarette smoking is the primary cause of chronic bronchi-

tis although prolonged exposure to irritating fumes or dust may also play a role.

The main symptoms of chronic bronchitis are a chronic cough and excessive mucous production. The condition is confirmed with pulmonary function testing in your physician's office. Chest X-rays are often needed to rule out other conditions causing a persistent cough.

If you are diagnosed with chronic bronchitis, the most important thing you can do is to stop smoking, and ask your doctor to help you quit. Not only will your bronchitis improve, but you will also reduce your chances of getting lung cancer.

Chronic bronchitis is usually treated with inhaled medications that help dilate the bronchial tubes. Another type of inhaler tends to decrease production of mucous. Frequently inhaled steroids are prescribed to limit chronic inflammation. Antibiotics are usually only prescribed when there is an acute exacerbation of symptoms due to a coexisting infection. Your physician may prescribe oxygen in more severe cases.

Because chronic bronchitis increases your risk of getting respiratory infections, all patients with chronic bronchitis should get an annual flu shot and a pneumonia vaccine.

Section 201.429F.2.b. Application for final development approval. All open spaces designated and proposed use for allowed conservation easement.


Section 201.429 I. Recordation. If applicable, conservation easement shall be recorded.

Section 201.502 C.1. & 7. Special Exception Use Permits. Change, "Zoning Inspector" to "Zoning Administrator."







Non-resident numbers in school district continue to rise

The Lowell School District is 120 students richer this year than it was a year ago.

Of that total, 49 (41 percent) are non-resident students. The accumulative number of non-resident students coming into the district, over the last three years, now totals 101. The 49 non-resident students means an additional

Lowell Schools from 14 other school districts over the last three years.

"I think people like the Lowell program. They feel it has a lot to offer and that Lowell is a nice place to be," said Connie Gillette, assistant superintendent for finance. "Lowell has a good reputation academically and offers students a great academic opportunity."

Bleke identified convenience as a factor in the equation. The Kent Intermediate School District (KISD), of which Lowell is a member, opted out of the governor's state schools of choice program. It was identified as being too restrictive.

The KISD then went ahead and drafted its own schools of choice plan... one it identified as being friendlier to schools and parents.

It gave parents a bigger window of opportunity to apply for a release from its district and under the KISD plan, the school gets the resident district foundation grant.

Under the state plan, a school receives the lower of the two schools' foundation grants for a non-resident student. There are 24 resident students in Lowell attending another school.

Under both the state and KISD plans, schools can release students after the identified time lines.

"The time lines are more for organizational purposes," Bleke said. "The needs of a kid should always come over the need for a time line."





HEALTH CARE FOR CHILDREN

MIChild (pronounced 'My Child') is a new statewide program being implemented to provide health care coverage to uninsured children of working families. It is part of the federal Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) initiative.

Five Michigan counties (Kent, Lake, Newaygo, Saginaw, and Washtenaw) began enrollment in May, 1998. It was expected that by September, 1998, all Michigan counties will be enrolled in this insurance program for children.

MIChild provides health care coverage to children, up to age 19, in families who are at or below 200% of the federal poverty line, who do not have health insurance through an employer, and who are not eligible for Medicaid. In a family of four this could include income up to \$32,000 per year. The cost to the family is \$5 per month, totaling just \$60 per year. There are no co-pays or deductibles, and families have a choice of medical and dental plans. Covered services include well-child physicals, immunizations, diagnostic services, prescriptions, emergency services, mental health and substance abuse services, vision and hearing screening and dental care.

Enrollment includes filling out a short MIChild application and providing proof of income (e.g. previous year's W-2, paycheck stub, or recent bank statement). If you have not received a brochure on this program from your school, please call your child's building office to request this. Questions regarding filling in an application may be answered by phoning the MIChild toll free number of 1-888-988-6300.

RIGHT TO ACCESS AND PRIVACY OF STUDENT RECORDS


All parents and guardians of students under 18 years of age and all students 18 years of age or over have the right pursuant to the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974, to examine the official records, files and data of the school district directly relating to the student. They also have the right to challenge any of the contents of said records to insure their accuracy and fairness. Procedures for such examination and challenge, including hearings on a challenge, have been established by the Board of Education and will be made available upon request.

No records, files, or data directly relating to an individual student shall be made available to anyone without the consent and notification of the student or of the parents or guardians of a student under 18 years of age, except 1) the teachers and officials of this school district who have a legitimate educational interest in such information; 2) there has been a federal request for submission of student records in connection with a student's application for financial aid; or 3 when a request for transfer of records is made by a school in which the student seeks or intends to enroll.

All requests for examination of records made by parents or guardians and eligible students shall be directed to the office of the principal having custody of such records.

The school district may disclose "Directory Information" from the educational records of a student. Lowell has defined the following as "Directory Information": name of student, participation in officially-recognized activities and sports, weight and height of members of athletic teams, dates of attendance, awards received and class designation. If a parent or student (18 years or over) refuses to permit the disclosure of any or all of the categories of "Directory Information," the school district must be notified in writing.

FOCUS ON OUR SCHOOL



Each month we would like to share information with the community regarding our buildings and what special things they are doing to make education beneficial and interesting for the students they teach. This month we would like to put our focus on the Runciman and Riverside buildings, located at the east end of Lowell on High and Monroe streets.

RUNCIMAN BUILDING PROGRAMS:

A Pre-Primary Impaired (PPI) program serves children 2 1/2 - 5 vears old who have special needs as defined within state special education guidelines. To be eligible, a preschooler must demonstrate significant delays in certain areas. A major purpose of P.P.I. is to enable voung children to participate more fully in school and community experiences. There are four classes which meet 2 1/2 hours per day, 4 or 5 days per week. A number of days each month are set aside for a parent component of the program. A full-time teacher, paraprofessional and part-time support persons staff our classrooms.

Lowell's 4-Year Old Readiness Program is designed to promote the overall development of children who turn four by December 1st each year. These children will be attending Kindergarten the following year and just need a little boost before entering the regular classroom setting. There are eligibility factors which must be considered in order for a child to be enrolled in this program. The Readiness Program meets 4 days per week for a 2 1/2 hour session. Parents are involved through home visits, school conferences, workshops, field trips and classroom visitation.

Our New Dawn program is an alternative high school setting for pregnant teenage girls and young mothers who choose not to attend the regular high school. Following the birth of their babies, the girls may make use of the Nursery provided in the same building and return either to New Dawn or to the regular general education setting. In addition to academics, classes offered include pre-natal and post-natal care, nutrition, parenting, and child development.

NATURE'S PLACE AT CHERRY CREEK

The Cherry Creek Elementary School students, teachers and parents started an outdoor education program during the last school year. Work has been done on developing the pond, meadow, forest and wetland area just west of the school, which is located on Foreman

Currently students and staff are in the process of clearing trail areas and covering these trails with wood chips. There are several ways the community can help in this worthwhile endeavor:

- · donation of shovels, rakes, clippers, trimmers, or
- · donation of wood chips needed to cover the trails
- · volunteer hours to help this project see completion

SPIRIT STORE



RIVERSIDE BUILDING:



Unity High School is another alternative education setting for boys and girls who cannot be successful in the regular general education setting at Lowell High School. As well as receiving their daily academics, these students learn life skills from on-site visits, such as their recent trip to the Grand Rapids Press. On September 23, fifty students learned the inner workings of a metropolitan newspaper by touring each department.

They were able to interact with the employees, finding out the specific job responsibilities each had, as well as observing each in their work setting. The information they learned at the Press, along with other forms of written media, are incorporated into their daily course work. The timeliness and relevance of using copies of the Grand Rapids Press within the classrooms provide teachers and students with real-life experiences and information which can be applied during daily lessons.



NEW FACE AT ADMINISTRATION OFFICES

Recently hired to work in Jim White's Curriculum and Instruction Office is Chris Maldonado. She will be filling the position vacated by Kathe Biggs, whose husband was transferred last January to Marshall, Michigan. Chris and her husband, Dan, have a 3 1/2 year old son, Alex, who keeps them very busy. Currently they live in Grand Rapids, where Dan works for Erb Lumber. ECONOMICS ON THE SECOND GRADE LEVEL

This year some Cherry Creek second graders will learn about economics by participating in a mini-economy. This simulation will allow students to see what it is like to have a job, pay bills and budget money. Students will be "employed" in the classroom and receive a biweekly pay check. After cashing their checks for classroom cash, students have to pay rent, taxes, utilities and decide if they want to buy health insurance. Fines will be collected for not following classroom rules and turning in late assignments. Bonuses will be paid for good deeds and extra work, to name just two.

The second graders will have the opportunity to purchase items from the Econo-Mart located in their classrooms. The outcome is that students will better understand some of the decisions their families must make when creating a budget and choosing which bills to pay and what items to purchase. It is hoped this simulation will be a great motivation and give students an active rather than passive role in the learning

There are many, many areas of instruction taught within the walls of our school buildings.
