

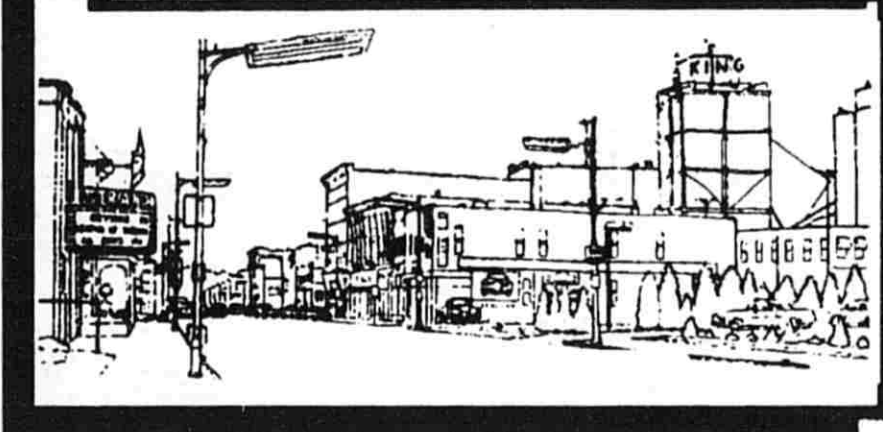

Marching Toward Decision

••• The Lowell Board of Education is scheduled to make a preliminary decision in April on which of the three options it will choose to deal with district growth.

Lowell School District's march toward a decision on how it can best address increased student enrollment grows nearer.

The board of education is slated to make a preliminary decision in April on what direction it will take.

The eight options presented to it by the demographics study committee have been narrowed to three following input by the committee, administration and community members.

The foundation for choosing the options was based on maintaining the highest quality education standard, economic accountability, long-term thinking which will allow future boards to make sound educational decisions, and using a flexible approach so as not to overbuild and to build conservatively.

Between now and the April board meeting, the district will be conducting four community forums to discuss potential options that it believes will allow the school district to accommodate current and future student growth.

The forums will be held on Tuesday, Feb. 22 at Alto Elementary from 7-9 p.m.; Saturday, Feb. 26 at Runciman Board of Education office from 10 a.m. until noon; Monday, Feb. 28 at Cherry Creek Elementary from 7 until 9 p.m.; and Tuesday, Feb. 29 at Runciman Board of Education office from 9 until 11 a.m.

Lowell superintendent Bert Bleke said any plan must allow room so it can react and make adjustments to changing conditions.

"With our decision we must think 10-15 years in the future, but at the same time allow future boards to make adjustments based on sound educational decisions," Bleke said.

It is estimated that a bond issue for new buildings will mean an increase anywhere from 2 - 2.5 mills.

An increase of 2.3 mills would mean an extra \$115 per year to an owner of a \$100,000 home or 31.5 cents per day.

Of the eight options, two, three and eight are still being considered.

Option II (Phase I) calls for a high school addition which would increase the student capacity to 1,600 and for a new school which would house seventh- and eighth-graders. It would shift the makeup of students at the middle school (5th- & 6th-graders) and Alto Elementary (K-4). Construction for these buildings would take place during the 2001-02 school year. They would open in 2002-03.

Phase II of Option II calls for a new K-4 building to open in 2007-08.

Option III (Phase I) suggests that in 2002-03, the high school capacity be increased to 1,400; the middle school house 7th- & 8th-graders; Cherry Creek house 5th- & 6th-graders; Alto Elementary hold K-4 students; and Bushnell and two new elementary buildings hold K-4 students.

Lowell manufacturers seek abatements

As neighbors, Root-Lowell Mfg. Co. and Litehouse Inc.

(Chadalee Farms) have watched one another grow and prosper over the last 47 years.

That growth will continue in the new century as both Lowell manufacturers are seeking tax abatements in connection with improving their facilities.

Root-Lowell's petition to establish an Industrial Development District under Public Act 198 to qualify for property tax abatements was recently approved by the city.

The Lowell company received site plan approval for a 70,000 square foot expansion to its plant by the planning commission on Jan. 10. It will accommodate a warehouse addition and add five new jobs.

Litehouse, having already established a district, has applied for an industrial tax abatement related to the purchase of new equipment for new products, improvement of quality and treatment of water.

Litehouse qualifies for 12 years of abatement under the point system adopted by the council. Improvements in machinery and equipment proposed by Litehouse would cost \$2.121 million.

If Litehouse meets the criteria, the abatement request will be approved by the council and will then go before the state tax commission for the issuance of a certificate. The abatement would be for 50 percent of the projected tax value.

A public hearing is scheduled for Feb. 21.

Cable survey results in unchanged channel lineup

••• Approximately 22 percent of Lowell Light and Power/Lowell Cable Television subscribers responded to the Adult Pay-Per-View survey - 3,019 (78 percent) customers did not respond.

Only 26 votes separated those who felt that adult Pay-Per-View should be removed from the cable system from those who felt it should not be.

Following a Tuesday morning meeting of the LL&P/Lowell Cable Board, Tom Richards, programming/marketing manager, released a statement indicating that it had considered the results of the survey and voted to leave the system's pay-per-view channel line-up unchanged.

Richards added that the board would elaborate on its position in a drafted statement to the Lowell City Council.

"I think we got a pretty good survey response (22

percent). The response to surveys is normally below 10 percent," Richards explained. "While 22 percent felt strongly about the issue, there were a lot more who did not feel strong enough one way or the other to respond."

The difference between those who felt adult pay-per-view should be removed (11.4 percent - 443) and those who felt it shouldn't (10.7 percent - 417) was less than one percent or 26 votes.

Richards conceded there may be circumstances where the LL&P/Lowell Cable Board could change its decision.

The board did not make its decision believing it would be a temporary one.

Lowell Light & Power/Lowell Cable customers had roughly 10 days to respond to the survey.

Developer to complete sewer feasibility study

An agreement between Thornapple River Developers and Bowne Township calls for a \$17,000 sewer feasibility study to be completed.

Thornapple River Developers, which proposes putting in 400 trailers on a 90-acre site at the 11,000 block of 64th St. west of Alden Nash, will be responsible for the cost of the study.

Sandy Kowalczyk, Bowne Township clerk, stated that the study is on hold until the developers are able to get the monies together to cover the cost.

The study would determine if it is feasible to enlarge Bowne Township's existing sewer system or if developers will have to build an SBR system meeting the township's requirements.

Once the study is completed, a site plan could then be presented to the township on the proposed development.

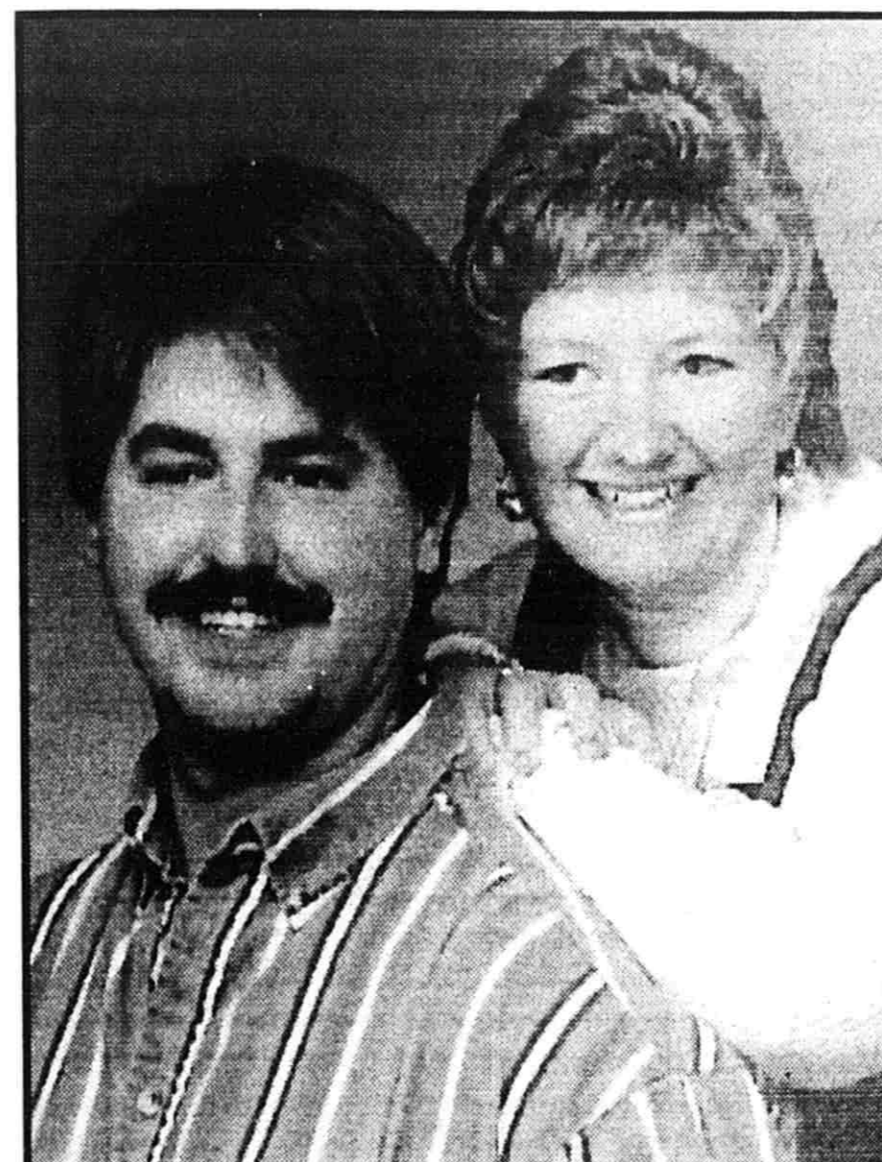

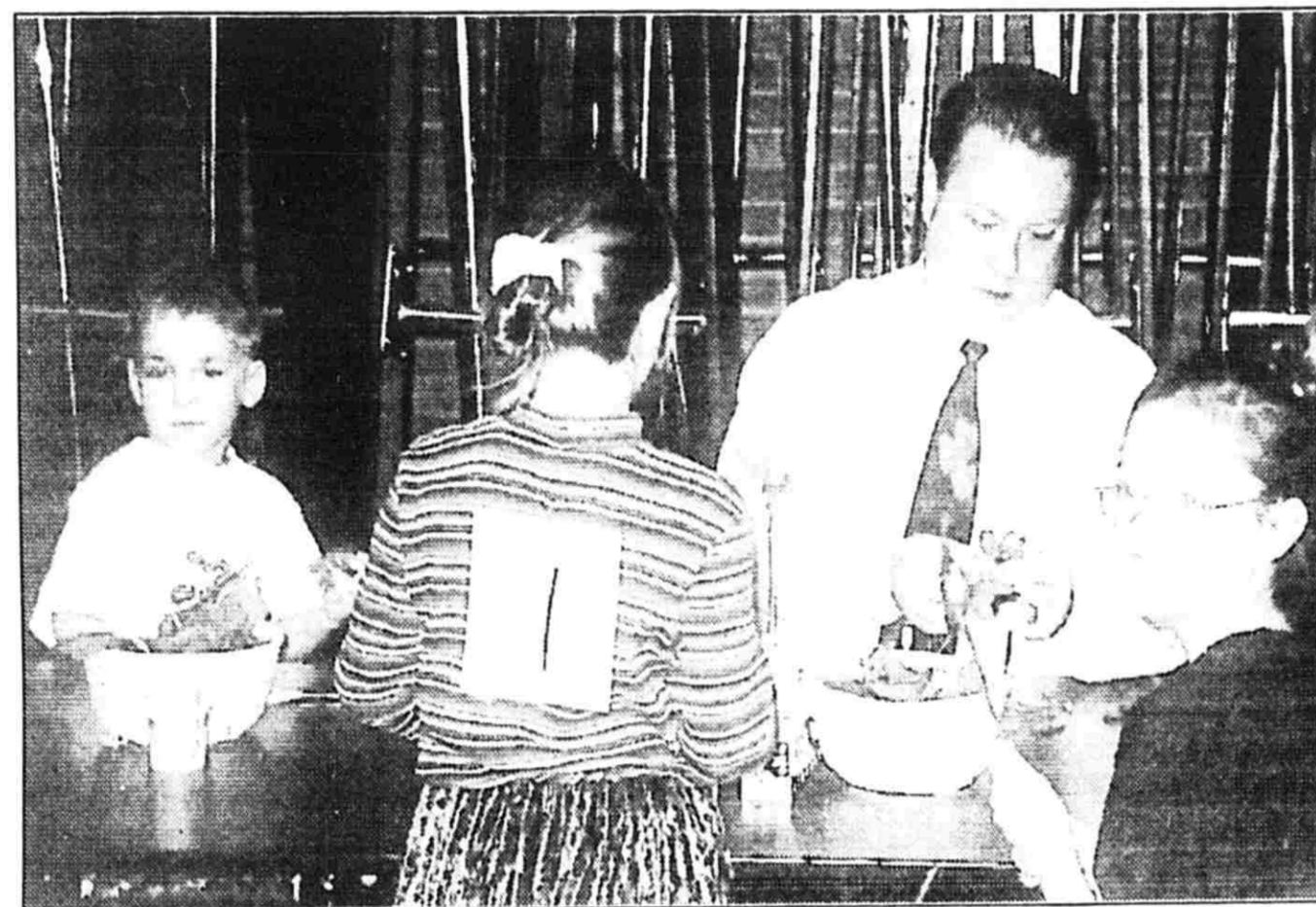

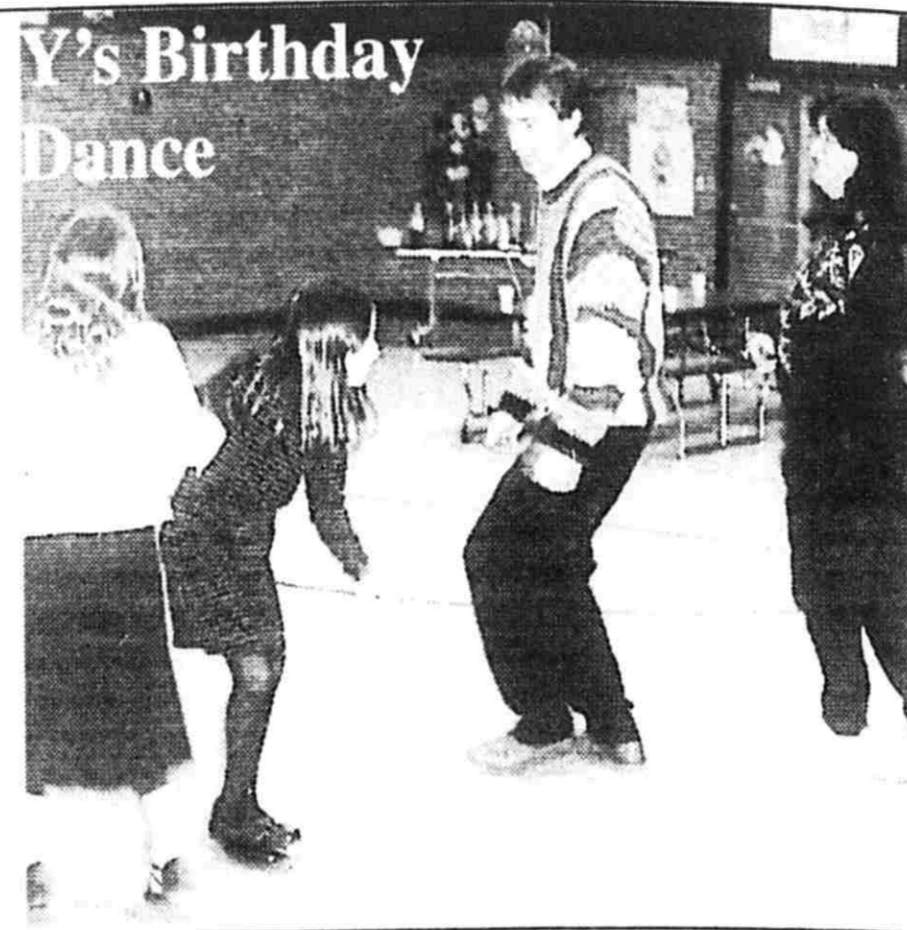

SUMMARY OF PROPOSED ZONING AMENDMENTS

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that a public hearing before the Vergennes Township Planning Commission will be held on **March 6, 2000 at 7:00 PM, at the Vergennes Township Hall**, located at 10381 Bailey Drive, Lowell, MI 49331 to consider proposed amendments to the Vergennes Township Zoning Ordinance. A summary of the proposed amendments are as follows:

Amend Section 201.202 V. Lot Area, Definitions Specific Terms - to clarify lot area and road right of way calculations.

Amend Section 201.304 (B) (14) Rural Agricultural District - Permitted Uses - to add non agricultural accessory buildings as a permitted use for clarification.

Amend Section 201.308 (B) (27) Commercial District - Special Exception Uses - to add accessory buildings as a use for clarification.

Amend Section 201.309 (B) (1) (j) Industrial District - Permitted Uses to add accessory buildings as a permitted use for clarification.

Amend Section 201.305 (B) (7) R-1 District - Permitted Uses - to allow accessory buildings to be used for all permitted uses for clarification.

Amend section 201.3075 (B) R-L Lake Residential District - Permitted Uses-to add accessory buildings as a permitted use for clarification.

Amend section 201.306 R-2 (G) Medium Density Single Family Residential District - G. Floor Area Requirements - to add language to clarify that mobile homes can have a width of 22 feet, other dwellings 24 feet.

Amend section 201.408 (B) Driveways -- to eliminate this section which specifies setback distances from the improved area of a driveway to a side lot line.

Amend section 201.404 (B) Animal and pet restrictions in residential areas -- to amend for clarification that in R-A and R-1 districts modifying the setbacks for an animal shelter from 150 feet to 75 feet from property lines.

Amend section 201.419 Private Stables -- to amend for clarification in districts where animals are permitted, that the animal shelter setback change from 150 feet to 75 feet from property lines.

Amend section 201.202 Definitions Specific Terms - by adding the following definition: 201.202 (A) (1) Accessory Building, Minor: A minor accessory building shall mean an accessory building as defined herein with a gross floor area of not more than two hundred (200) square feet and a maximum height of twelve (12) feet.

Amend section 201.402 (A) Accessory buildings, construction, timing and location limitations -- to add language that a bond is to be provided in order to construct an accessory building before the principal building and describing a 10 foot setback for accessory buildings from a principal building

Amend further section 201.402 (A) -- to add language that accessory buildings must be stick built or the equivalent building construction. It does not allow accessory buildings to be converted from old mobile homes, semi-trailers, tanks and other objects but excepting temporary tools sheds.

Amend further section 201.402 (C) -- to add language allowing for minor accessory buildings; 2 allowed per lot, a setback for rear and side yards of 5 feet, none allowed in the front yard and a sketch of yard placement to be provided.

Amend further section 201.402 (D) -- to add language that exempts school bus stop structures if they are not located in the road right of way, or a permit from the Road Commission must be obtained.

The complete text of the proposed ordinance amendments are on file in the offices of the Township Clerk at the **Vergennes Township Hall, 10381 Bailey Drive, Lowell, MI 49331; Phone: (616) 897-5651 [fax 897-5674]**. Written and oral comments regarding the proposed amendments will be received until the conclusion of the public hearing. Written comments may be addressed to the Township Clerk, Chairperson or to the Planning Coordinator at the Township Offices. Reasonable accommodations can be provided without charge, including auxiliary aids and services as necessary. If you require special needs, please contact the Township Clerk, at the Township offices at least 48 hours before the hearing to arrange for the accommodation.
