... The life stages of a butterfly and its diverse beauty are being used in a collaborative public art program effort by Lowell Area Schools and the Lowell Area Arts Council.

As part of celebrating 25 years of growth, the Lowell Area Arts Council has embarked on a public program in collaboration with Lowell Area Schools utilizing the beauty of the butterfly.

The butterfly art project has also served as an extension of the curriculum via teaching children about migration, symmetry and the life cycle.

Participating in the public art program, during the month of November, were first-, second-, third- and fifth-grade classrooms from Alto.

The creation of each butterfly's sculpture took place at the school. Over a

three-day period each classroom (11 in all), through the assistance of an assigned artist, worked in small groups on the sculpture. In addition, students wrote narratives and poems to describe their experience with this program.

"I thought it was good everybody got to participate," said Alto fifth-grader, Austin Tackman. "With a bunch of people working together it worked out nice."

Lowell Area Arts Council executive director, Lorain Smalligan approached elementary principals of their possible interest in coordinating the project with the council.

"To start, the idea was rather nebulous. But it turned into such an enriching experi-

ence we want to do it all over again.

"I didn't realize the sculptures, when completed, would be as sensational as they are," Alto Elementary principal, Mary Ann Schramm said. "The project combined community talent with the schools."

The public art program brought together students with 16 artists from Lowell and the Greater Grand Rapids Area to design and create larger than life butterfly sculptures.

As a group project each classroom creates one butterfly sculpture utilizing all of the ideas of the students.

"The project took the opinions of everyone in a large group," said Katie Jelsma.

Ferrellgas provides homeowners tips to stay safe this winter

According to the National Fire Protection Association, the safest way to heat is with gas. Many Americans already

take advantage of the benefits of heating with gas, as millions of people already depend on propane or natural gas as their primary source of heat.

Steve Drake, district manager of Ferrellgas Lowell location, says his company and his employees take propane safety seriously.

"Ferrellgas is committed to helping homeowners enjoy the comfort and convenience of propane," said Drake. "Taking just a few minutes to review important safety information will help lead to a more comfortable and safe winter for all propane users."

To help homeowners remain safe throughout the winter, Ferrellgas is providing a list of important tips to remind propane users how to store propane cylinders and use propane appliances safely and efficiently.

Propane appliances

- All furnaces can collect lint and dirt and should be cleaned regularly. Contact a reputable heating contractor to perform the cleaning, along with an equipment check up.

- Drain your water heater periodically to get rid of sediment build-up on the bottom of the tank.

- When using a space heater, it is essential that the space above and around the unit be free from any combustible materials, such as draperies or plastics. Check the manufacturer's instructions for clearance distances.

- Water can damage the internal safety mechanisms in the gas controls of an appliance. If you suspect that your appliance controls may have gotten wet, contact a trained technician immediately.

- Never attempt to light your own pilot lights. Call a trained technician to perform this task for you.

- Read and understand all educational and warning materials given to you by your propane supplier and appliance manufacturers. Make sure you share this information with your family.

Propane cylinders

- Never store or use a propane cylinder in your home or any other enclosed space, such as a garage.

- Make sure to read all warning labels attached to the cylinder.

- Don't use, store, or transport cylinders where they can be exposed to high temperatures because the pressure relief valve may open, allowing a large amount of flammable gas to escape.

- When transporting a cylinder not in use, keep it secure in an upright position with the cylinder valve turned off.

Ferrellgas offices provide copies of the Ferrellgas Propane Safety Plan which will give many proven tips on how to be safe with propane.

Ameritech agrees to reimburse city

Contingent on receiving its \$850 reimbursement from SBC-Ameritech for expenses incurred by Shaler Excavating of additional traffic sign rentals, the city of Lowell agreed to make its final payment of \$850 to Shaler to close out the N. Division Street project.

Dave Austin, of Williams & Works, pointed out through preconstruction conference minutes the need for Ameritech to expedite its work on Division Street. It went seven weeks

beyond the original estimated completion. Ameritech originally indicated that it would not consider reimbursement as its work was outside of the paved area and did not require the road to be closed.

After receiving a letter and attachments from the city, Ameritech said that a reimbursement in the full amount would be made to the city.

Builder and city reconcile parcel mixup

Howerda Builders and the city agreed to swap small parcels of property on Shepard Drive as part of a housing development.

It was later discovered, however, that Howerda's parcel is owned by the city. The parcel is needed for access to the property.

Through an advertised bid process, Howerda was awarded

the parcel for a sum of \$10 with the city retaining any utility rights.

"What was surveyed and what was shown on the map were two different things," said Lowell city manager, Dave Pasquale. "The road right-of-way overlapped the builder's property. This will reconcile the problem."

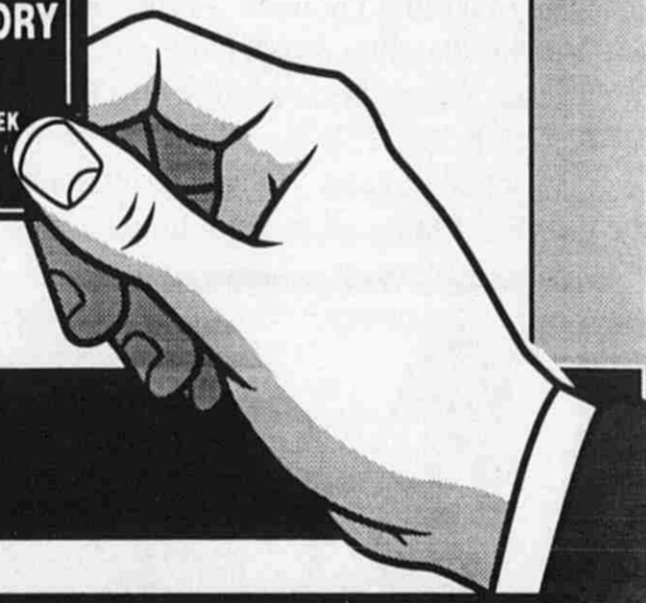

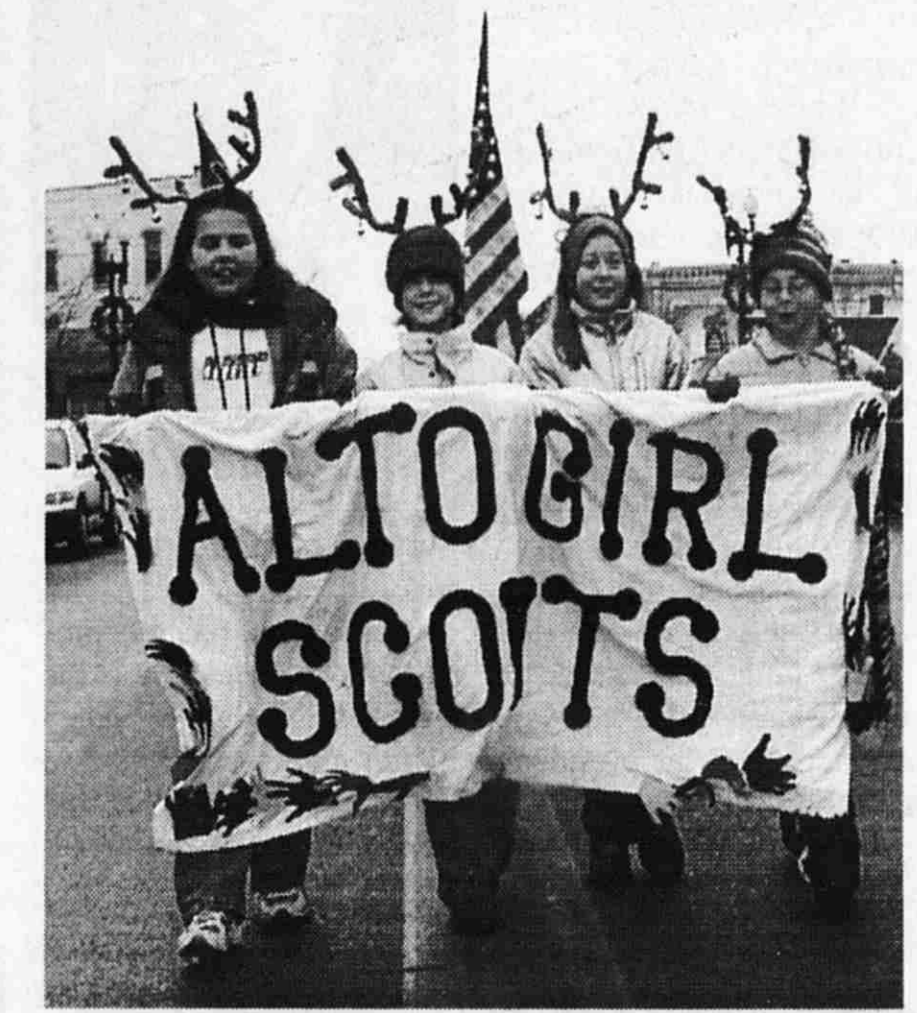
